Why the RNLI needs this role:	This role will help us save lives at sea by ensuring the Lifeboat(s) at this lifeboat station is always ready for service and commanding the all weather lifeboat at sea.		
Potential time commitment:	Will vary depending on the operational need of the lifeboat station. Willingness to volunteer at weekends and anti-social hours.

Responsible for:	Crew when on service, exercise, passages and trials		
Role specific requirements:	 Stepping down age: 65 May be subject to DBS/PVG/Garda checks during the recruitment process 		
This role involves:	 Complying with the RNLI Volunteer Commitment A willingness to volunteer for weekend relief and other periods of absence at stations where there is a full-time coxswain, Commanding the lifeboat on service, exercise, passages and trials so far as availability allows and lead the crew when ashore Maintaining competence under Competency Based Training (CoBT) to fulfil the role and contribute to the training of the crew and shore crew Assisting the station mechanic and/or coast staff with maintenance and repairs Contributing to the operational efficiency of the station, lifeboats and equipment including making ready for service once a service or exercise is completed. Ensuring familiarity with the Green Book of Regulations, Synergy Based Working Practices and other volunteer policies and documents appropriate to your role Becoming involved in other activities as required 		
Training and support:	 Completion of competencies as required by CoBT applicable for volunteer roles Lifeboat in a permanent state of readiness
